Includes reprint of Royal Order for the use of Postage Stamps in the Philippines Excellent illustrations of largest blocks of the 1854 issues.

Quinones, Petronilo.

[Quinones, P. \(1948\)](#). **Our history as reflected on stamps**. Philippine Journal of Philately, vol 1 no 1, p25. (September-October 1948).

A brief overview of the Spanish stamps noting the wording CORREOS INTEROR or CORREOS only was used in the early stamps until 1872 when the words "CORREOS FILIPINAS" appeared on the stamps and later in 1880 "FILIPINAS". The article mentions that all the pre-war [i.e. World War II] philatelic records of the Bureau of posts were burned and destroyed during the battle of liberation of Manila.

Quinto, F.

[Cotter, B., & Quinto, F. \(1897\)](#). **Catalogo descriptivo de sellos de correos telegrafos y tarjetas postales de las Islas Filipinas**. 24pp. publ. Manila. (in Spanish)

The catalogue was printed in Manila and sold in the Philippines for 0.75ptas. The catalogue is not illustrated but included prices for which individual stamps could be purchased.

Ragatz, Lowell.

The catalogue is based on a series of articles published in various publications between 1871 and 1881 and published as a book in 1952. The articles describe the forgeries made by the Spiro brothers in Hamburg, Germany. An introductory essay and comprehensive index is included by Lowell Ragatz

Since the Spud Papers were published in the late 19th century, collectors have found many more Spiro forgeries. Today, more than 400 different forgeries have been recorded.

## Revue Philatelique.

The **Revue Philatelique** was a French language magazine, first issued in January 1890. It was the organ and property of the Societe Philatelique Francaise, Paris, France. It was renamed **Revue Philatelique Francaise** in 1896.

Uncertainty as to what the "C-1898-Resellado-1899-T" means some light hearted suggestions are fielded: "triple-carrot" or a tax on pianos!

Catalogue of stamp errors. Those from the Spanish-Philippines include "colour errors of the 1872 issue 12 blue and 62c rose, and the 1854 "CORROS" error on the 1r blue.

Reyes y Jose, Ricardo A.

[Reyes, R. \(1906\)](#). **Letter to Arthur Maury, Paris dated 10 March 1905**. Le Collectionneur de Timbres-Poste no 308, pp. 161-168.

The letter is reproduced in [Collectionneur de Timbres-Poste \(1906b\)](#). The letter is responding to Maury regarding a request for information regarding the La Union overprints. Reyes provides the information that Filipino collectors, even those that held official positions in La Union believe the stamps to be fantasy. The letter includes names of philatelists and employees of the Post office in the Philippines at that time.

[Reyes, R. \(1936\)](#). **Los sellos antiguos de Filipinas cancelados a pluma**. [Old stamps of the Philippines cancelled with a pen]. A.F.F. (Magazine of the Asociacion Filatelica de Filipinas), vol 1 no 9, pp. 19-20. (September 1936) (in Spanish).

The author disputes the assertion in the Senf catalogue that pen cancels on old stamps represented unused remnants. Reyes notes that unused sheets of the 1854 issues were found without cancels or pen markings in the old warehouses of Manila. He also describes the baeza cancel and notes it is only found with "Manila" and suggests that pen cancels were used in the provinces and other towns to cancel stamps and that the pen cancels therefore indicate postal usage.

Account of the Philippine currency and the 1854 issues including description of the "CORROS" error. Reports that the first stamps were engraved at a house in the corner of San Fernando Street and Plaza de Binondo, Manila. Discussion of whether there are two printings or not (of fine and coarse lines) and observed that a sheet owned by Calman indicates some with fine lines and some with coarse (although the article is not specific as to which sheet was examined). Comments that Moens was the first to make a 'minutious' study of these stamps. Notes that Louis van Schaick owns a block of four with CORROS error. Reports the existence of forgeries and cancels. See also [Stanfield \(1976\)](#). Reprinted in Spanish in [Reyes \(1949a\)](#).

Appears to be a reprint from A.F.F. Description and illustration of forgeries of the 1859 5c issue.

A critical resume of the postal issues of the Philippines under different regimes. Suggests that there was little variation during the Spanish period with those responsible lacking imagination or perhaps equipment.

Report of updated information on first day usage of cancellations. Notes that Spanish-Philippine stamps were accepted as postage at the Manila post office which opened on 14 August 1898.

Roig, Mario S.

[Roig, M. \(1906a\)](#). **Reprints of Spain, Cuba, Porto Rico and the Philippines**. The Philatelic West, vol 33, no 2. unnumbered page. (31 March 1906).

This article only talks about reprints of Spanish stamps. It was intended to be a serial article on reprints of the four countries, but the first instalment only addresses reprints of Spanish stamps. The later instalments detail 'reprints' which often refer to forgeries of Cuba and Puerto Rico, but they do not appear to include issues of the Philippines. The author's name is incorrectly listed as Mario L. Roig in this piece, but this is corrected to Mario S. Roig in subsequent articles of the series. The same article appears in the Philatelic West and Camera News (except it is referenced vol 32 no 2).

Charles Roussin's catalogue with a total of 124 pages was published in parts as supplements to L' Ami des Timbres. The first edition commenced in 1874 and was completed in 1876. The catalogue included postal and fiscal stamps.

Charles Roussin's catalogue with a total of 217 pages plus plates was published in parts as supplements to L' Ami des Timbres. The second edition was published between 1876 and 1880. The catalogue included postal, telegraph and fiscal stamps. Continued in [Roussin \(1880\)](#).

This supplement only includes a plate illustrating the stamps, it is continued with a second plated in [Roussin \(1884b\)](#) and catalogue list in [Roussin \(1885\)](#).
