The **Philatelic Bulletin** was published by the Philippine Postal Corporation in various formats and frequency. The **Philatelic Bulletin** recorded details of new issues and first day covers.

In 2011 the bulletins were created by Boyet Dones and May DP Torres on behalf of Maria Josefina M dela Cruz (Postmaster General and CEO). In 2012 the bulletins were created by Kenth Ariza DC Manuzon on behalf of Maria Josefina M dela Cruz (Postmaster General and CEO). In 2013 and the bulletins were created by John Robert C Alfonso on behalf of Maria Josefina M dela Cruz (Postmaster General and CEO).

Between 2020 and 2023 the bulletins were created by Maria Abigail D. Tarroza.

Publications ceased in 2023 following the fire which affected the Manila Post Office building.

Sison</p> <p>Winning photos in the contest conducted/sponsored by the United Nations Information Center (Manila) highlighting this year's celebration of the International Year of the Forests: <b>Stamp 1:</b> Shows Batlag Falls in Tawitayan, Rizal captured by Phil-Revies which won the First Prize. <b>Stamp 2:</b> Shows a big tree in Pampanga, Laguna captured by Karol Franco which won the Second Prize. The cachet on the First Day Cover shows the landscape in Catanagan, Batangas captured by Proceso Solillo which won the Third Prize.</p>  <p>The year 2011 was declared the International Year of Forests by the United Nations to raise awareness and strengthen the sustainable forest management, conservation and sustainable development of all types of forests for the benefit of current and future generations.</p> <p>Forests are an integral part of global sustainable development. The UN's Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) estimates that every year 130,000 km<sup>2</sup> of the world's forests are lost due to deforestation. Conversion to agricultural land, unsustainable logging of timber, unaided land management practices, and creation of human settlements are the most common reasons for this loss of forested areas.</p> <p>According to the International Union for the Conservation of Nature (IUCN) and the Global Partnership on Forest Landscape Restoration, "Across the globe, by more than a billion hectares of lost and degraded forest and that could be restored."</p> <p>Stamps and Official First Day Covers will be available starting October 24, 2011 at the Postage and Philatelic Department, Manila Central Post Office, Door 203, Liwasing Bangkay, 1000 Manila and at all Regional Offices of the Philippine Postal Corporation.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>MA JOSEFINA M. The centennial anniversary is being celebrated with the theme, "Consolacion Yesterday, Today, and Beyond: Fulfilling Dreams, Building Legacies".</p> <p>The Municipality of Consolacion has a long history. It was previously a barrio of Mandaua called "Kamping" after the type of crab found in the locale. Eventually, the small barrio grew, and its residents requested that it be made a municipality. The then Governor-General of Cebu granted this petition. As a gesture of gratitude and goodwill, Kamping was renamed "Consolacion" after the Governor-General's daughter. This petition succeeded via the efforts of the townspeople. After a brief period of being brought back to the status of barrio in 1902-1903, Consolacion was reestablished as a municipality in 1903 by Governor-General Burton Harrison.</p> <p>The Sarok Festival in Consolacion, Cebu is a source of pride for the city. This lively festival is celebrated alongside the municipality's founding anniversary. It highlights the sarok, a woven hat made of bamboo and banana strips, made by farmers as protection from the harsh noonday sun. Another contribution to cultural heritage is the "Milagros de Cebu", a dance which originated in Consolacion.
